

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES, PRIZES AND RULES APPLICABLE TO SHEEP

Conditions of Entry

101. The rules appearing in this Schedule form part of the Regulations and conditions of entry to an Event at the Show. In the event of any inconsistency between the Regulations and these rules, the Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the Regulations provide otherwise.

All Exhibitors must sign the declaration on the entry form, to the effect that to the best of their knowledge, no Sheep exhibited by them should show any signs or symptoms of disease at the time of the Show. Failure to sign the declaration will render all Sheep of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited.

All entries must be accompanied by the Sheep Animal Health Declaration Form signed by the exhibitor or authorised representative and a Government Veterinary Officer.

102. **ENTRIES CLOSE AND MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE SOCIETY AT THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AT THE ROYAL SHOW GROUNDS, EPSOM ROAD, ASCOT VALE, 3032, BY NOT LATER THAN 4.30pm ON FRIDAY 26TH JUNE, 2002. WHETHER SUCH ENTRIES ARE DELIVERED IN PERSON OR BY POST. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPLICABLE FEE:-**

FOR TROPHY CLASSES ONLY THE FEE IS \$15.00 PER GROUP FOR MEMBERS AND \$25.00 PER GROUP FOR NON-MEMBERS. FLEECE CLASSES ARE \$7.50 PER ENTRY.

SCAN FEES

SCAN FEES HAVE BEEN SET AT \$6.00 PER ANIMAL AND THIS AMOUNT MUST BE SHOWN SEPARATELY ON YOUR ENTRY FORM AND THE AMOUNT INCLUDED WITH YOUR TOTAL ENTRY PAYMENT.

103. Entries are limited to two in each Single Class and one in each Pair Class from any one Exhibitor.

104. No exhibit in the Pair Classes can compete in Single Classes and vice versa.

105. Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number and no particulars other than the breeders' name and date of shearing will be published in the Show Catalogue.

Sheep must be identified by tag number prior to inspection to qualify as an exhibit.

Sheep must be identified by tag number on a form provided by the Society prior to inspection, to become eligible to compete.

GST - ENTRY FEES AND PRIZEMONEY

ENTRY FEES AND OTHER CHARGES

All entry fees in individual sections include GST - all exhibitors, whether they are registered or not, are to pay the full amount as stated in the relevant Prize Schedule and/or entry form.

Exhibitors who are registered for GST Purposes may be able to claim an input tax credit for GST. To assist with any claim for credit, we will forward all exhibitors, on request, a tax invoice/receipt of Entry Fees and other charges received. **Please nominate in the space provided and enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope.**

At time of entry, please ensure that if you have an Australian Business Number (ABN), you nominate this in the space provided. For those who register at a later date, please forward your details to the Society immediately.

Prices for catalogues, lockers, parking and all other services provided include GST.

PRIZEMONEY

Prizemoney as stated in the relevant Prize Schedule, does not include GST.

GST will be added to the Prizemoney for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes and have provided an ABN.

EWES IN LAMB

106. A ewe entered as "with lamb of her own breed at foot" may be transferred to the class provided for ewes of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, and vice versa. For the purpose of health regulations, lambs at foot must be held when not in their pen.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

ACCESS WILL BE FROM THE RAS FLOAT PARK, OFF LEONARD CRESCENT (Gate 8), EXHIBITORS WILL BE DIRECTED TO ENTRY POINT.

107. **SHEEP WILL BE PERMITTED TO BE PENNED OVER THE EVENING OF WEDNESDAY, 18TH SEPTEMBER 2002 BETWEEN THE TIMES OF 6.00 PM AND 7.00 AM ON THE MORNING OF THURSDAY, 19TH SEPTEMBER 2002. SHEEP MAY NOT BE REMOVED FROM THE GROUNDS UNTIL AFTER 6.00 PM ON MONDAY, 23RD SEPTEMBER, 2002. IT WOULD BE APPRECIATED IF ALL SHEEP COULD BE OUT BY MIDNIGHT TO HELP FACILITATE THE CHANGE OVER.**

YOUR ADVICE WOULD BE GREATLY APPRECIATED AS TO WHICH EVENING YOU WOULD PREFER TO ARRIVE AND IF YOU INTEND TO BRING A TRUCK.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

2002 SHEEP COMPETITIONS WILL BE CONDUCTED UNDER THE GUIDELINES AS SET OUT IN THE JOHNE'S DISEASE MARKET ASSURANCE PROGRAM.

CERTIFICATION FOR ALL ENTRIES THAT "FLOCKS BE A STATUS MN1 OR BETTER OR OVINE JOHNE'S DISEASE IS NOT KNOWN OR SUSPECTED TO HAVE OCCURRED DURING THE PAST 5 YEARS IN FLOCKS OR ON PROPERTIES FROM WHICH THESE ANIMALS ORIGINATE WILL BE THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENT FOR ALL STUD SHEEP (EXCLUDING ALPACAS AND GOATS) ENTERED IN THE ROYAL MELBOURNE SHOW. THAT IS TO SAY A MONITORED NEGATIVE STATUS WILL NOT BE A REQUIREMENT FOR ENTRY.

108. **RAM ENTRIES WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED FROM OVINE BRUCELLOSIS ACCREDITED FREE FLOCKS.**

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN EXHIBITORS

109. South Australian sheep may return to their place of origin providing they conform to South Australian regulations.

PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS AND DISAPPROVED EXHIBIT

110. All Exhibitors must sign a statutory declaration to the effect that to the best of their knowledge no sheep exhibited by them are affected by foot-rot, or show any signs or symptoms of the disease at time of exhibition and Johne's Disease has not been known or suspected or known to exist, on the property from which each animal was derived, during the period five (5) years immediately prior to movement. Failure to sign a statutory declaration will render all sheep of an Exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited, or to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire and physically sound by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon shall not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

111. The owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Society or a Veterinary Surgeon of the Society must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's Grounds. Subject to Rules 8.2 and 9.2 of the General Regulations, the Society reserves the absolute right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not in the opinion of the Society, up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show. Such a decision or determination is entirely within the discretion of the Society and shall not be questioned or challenged in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

112. Exhibits must not be rugged after judging day during the hours the Show is open to the Public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of \$50.00 for every infringement of this regulation.

PREPARATION OF SHEEP AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

113. Exhibitors or their employees are not permitted to prepare (i.e., trim, etc.) exhibits in any passageway or in any judging area in the Pavilion after 5.00 pm on the day prior to judging day.

No preparation (including trimming) of SHORN sheep will be permitted after the commencement of inspection unless extenuating circumstances exist and permission is granted by the Chief Steward. The grant of permission is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward.

No trimming will be permitted after judging except with the permission of the Chief Steward.

No tattooing of sheep is permitted on the Show Grounds.

The washing of legs of Poll Dorset Sheep is not permitted on the Show Grounds.

Exhibitors are not permitted to use powders or other substances on the face and/or colour on legs and feet in the preparation of sheep for showing.

114. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show. They must complete cleaning of pens occupied by their exhibits before 6.00 am each day on which sheep are at the Show.

ADVERTISING

115. No advertisements or notices (except by permission of the Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings. In the case of permission being granted, breed and stud signs must not exceed 1m x 0.5m. Signs may be placed on the pens advertising private sale, only after the auction is complete.

REGISTRATION

116. All sheep entered in Sections 61 - 82 inclusive must be recorded in flocks which are registered in the name of the Exhibitor in the flock book of a Breed Society recognised by the Society.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS (TATTOOS, ETC)

117. Each Breed Society in the Sheep Sections shall recommend to the Society an Inspector or Inspectors of sheep entered as exhibits in the breed of that particular Breed Society. The Society shall then appoint a person or persons as an Inspector or Inspectors who shall then examine all sheep entered in the relevant breed and discard any not up to standard and those not shorn in accordance with the Regulations.

The inspection of sheep may commence at 12 noon Thursday 19th September. YELLOW INSPECTION CARDS MUST BE HANDED INTO THE SHEEP SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE BY 10.00 am. IF THESE CARDS ARE NOT HANDED IN, SHEEP WILL NOT BE INSPECTED AND ARE THEREFORE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR JUDGING.

Poll Dorset sheep may be inspected at 10.00 am on Friday 20th September. SHEEP NOT IN THEIR ALLOTTED PENS AT THE TIME OF THE OFFICIAL INSPECTION MAY BE DISQUALIFIED BY THE CHIEF STEWARD. Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

118. All British Breeds of Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock book of the country of origin) must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association Ltd. in accordance with the rules of that Society.

All Poll Dorset Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the county of origin) must be tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Poll Dorset Association Inc. in accordance with the rules of that Association.

All Corriedale, Merino, White Suffolk and Drysdale Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be tattooed in accordance with the rules of their Associations.

All Texel Sheep exhibited must be tattooed with their breeders' registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Texel Stud Breeders Association Inc in accordance with the rules of that Association (except imported sheep which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Register of the country of origin).

119. Any sheep found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed may be liable to be disqualified by the Society. Any decision or determination by the Society to disqualify is entirely within its discretion and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

120. No exhibit may have their teeth filed or ground. Any decision or determination by the Chief Steward to disqualify is entirely within his discretion and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

ALL SHEEP ENTERED IN THE 1 1/2 YEARS OLD CLASSES MUST NOT BE SHOWING MORE THAN TWO TEETH. IF THERE ARE SIGNS OF FOUR TEETH ERUPTING, AN ANIMAL IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR EXHIBITION.

LAMBS AT FOOT ARE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN LAMB CLASSES AND MUST BE TATTOOED AND HELD WHEN NOT IN THEIR PEN.

THE DAMS OF SHEEP ENTERED IN THE LAMB CLASSES MUST NOT BE BROUGHT ON TO THE SHOW GROUNDS UNLESS THEY ARE ENTERED FOR EXHIBITION IN ANOTHER CLASS.

121. Disqualified sheep shall not be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Exhibitors of disqualified sheep may remove them from the Show Grounds.

SHORN AND UNSHORN SHEEP

122. All sheep in the British Breeds, Texels and Poll Dorset Classes (except shorn sheep) over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn between 1st August 2001 and 31st January 2002. Date of shearing to be given on entry form. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1st July, 2001. Merino Ewes must be shorn as at 15th August 2001 and Rams as at 1st March, 2002. The minimum wool length for Poll Dorsets and British Breeds (shortwool) in all woolly classes shall be 4cm.

Exhibits of shorn sheep, except those entered in Romney Classes 53, 56 and 59 must be closely and evenly shorn on or before the 1st September, 2002.

Corriedale sheep entered in shorn classes may not have more than 5cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.

Drysdale sheep must be shorn between the 1st and the 31st March, 2002.

Border Leicester sheep must be shorn in accordance with the regulations appearing at the beginning of that Section.

No Longwool sheep (except Romney and Border Leicester) entered in a shorn class may have more than 4cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection and no Shortwool sheep entered in a shorn class may have more than 2cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.

Sheep entered in the four Romney classes 57, 58, 63 and 64 must be machine shorn with standard thickness combs on or after 1st June of the year of the Show. Exhibitors are required to advise the Society before 26th May, 2002

that they intend exhibiting in such classes, so that shearing inspections can be completed by 9th June, 2002.

Sheep entered in the under 1 1/2 years old classes may be shorn or unshorn. If shorn this must have been carried out prior to 31st January, 2002, except Corriedales which are permitted to be shorn prior to the 31st March, 2002.

Sheep not shorn in accordance with the above regulations will be disqualified. Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the Showgrounds.

INSPECTION APPEALS

123. AN EXHIBITOR OR COMPETITOR MAY APPEAL AGAINST AN INSPECTOR'S DECISION.

SUBJECT TO THE REGULATIONS IN THE RELEVANT PRIZE SCHEDULE APPEALS SHALL BE ADDRESSED TO THE CHAIRMAN, SHEEP COMMITTEE, AND BE LODGED AT THE SHEEP SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE IN LENNON AVENUE, SHOW GROUNDS, BEFORE 6.00 PM ON THE DAY THE DECISION IN QUESTION HAS BEEN MADE. SUCH APPEALS SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED WITH A DEPOSIT OF \$50.00 WHICH MAY BE FORFEITED TO THE SOCIETY IF IN THE SOLE OPINION OF THE CHIEF STEWARD THE APPEAL IS UNFOUNDED, FRIVOLOUS OR VEXATIOUS.

THE APPEAL AND ALL MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM SHALL BE DETERMINED CONCLUSIVELY AS TO ALL MATTERS BY THE SOCIETY AND SHALL NOT BE THE SUBJECT OF ANY APPEAL TO ANY COURT OR ANY ORDER FOR REVIEW OR OF A SIMILAR NATURE.

FEED SHEDS, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

124. Feed sheds are available for Exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Society, a shed will be reserved for the period of exhibition at the Show at a charge of \$25. Exhibitors must provide their own locks for feed sheds.

No bedding other than straw may be used in any pens. For the convenience of Exhibitors, fodder merchants will attend the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc. Delivery of food stocks must be made before 8.00am each day during the Show.

JUDGING

125. The following regulations shall be read subject to regulations 15 through to 16 inclusive of the General Regulations.

Judges may, if they so desire, commence the judging on the sheep under 1 1/2 years.

126. Any animal entered which can be proved to the satisfaction of the Chief Steward to have received hormones shall be disqualified. The decision or determination of the Chief Steward shall be final and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

127. Except as otherwise directed, every attendant of an exhibit whilst parading such exhibit either before a Judge or in a Grand Parade, shall be neat and tidy, wear long trousers, and a clean and approved dustcoat or breed uniform. Such dustcoats or breed uniforms must in no way show any insignia or any distinctive markings indicating the Exhibitor's name and / or stud name or prefix. Breed uniforms must be submitted to the Society for approval at least 2 months prior to the Show. Sheep exhibit numbers must also be displayed during judging. These numbers must be collected by the Exhibitor from the Superintendent's Office. **Any Exhibitor or attendant not fulfilling these regulations will be excluded from competing in any judging.**

128. Persons in charge of exhibits at or in the judging ring shall not address the Judge unless authorised by the Steward in Charge or the Judge himself.

STRAWING AND CLEANING OF PENS

129. The Society will arrange for the strawing of all pens prior to the Show. The charge for each pen is included in the entry fee.

MUCKING OUT TIMES ARE BETWEEN 6.00 pm AND 6.00 am AND THESE TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

SHEEP SALES

130. SHEEP NOT PARADED BEFORE THE JUDGE SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR SALE. THIS REGULATION DOES NOT APPLY WHERE ONE OF A PAIR IS REJECTED BY THE INSPECTORS.

Exhibitors who sell sheep during the period of the Show must make arrangements for the Exhibit Entry Tickets to be transferred to the purchaser or his agents to enable the sheep to be removed from the Pavilion at the conclusion of the exhibition.

SMOKING

131. Smoking and naked flames are at all times prohibited in Lockers and Pavilions.

PRIZES

132. Ribbons and prize cards may be awarded to placegetters according to the table below.

Judging is subject to regulation 15. The Judge is under no obligation to award the prizes listed in the table where he considers in his absolute discretion that such prize or prizes are not to be awarded.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR AWARDS

133. The Most Successful Exhibitor Awards in all breeds will be calculated as follows:
Classes with 1 to 10 entries: First 3 points, second 2 points, third 1 point.
Classes with 11 to 30 entries: First 4 points, second 3 points, third 2 points, fourth 1 point.
Classes with over 30 entries: First 5 points, second 4 points, third 3 points, fourth 2 points, fifth 1 point.

Placings in Trophy, Objective Measurement and Group classes will not be taken into consideration when deciding these awards.

In the event of a tie, two points will be allotted for Champion awards and one point for Reserve Champion awards. If a tie still exists a count back, approved by the Society, will be made to determine the winner.

EXCESS ENTRIES

134. In the event of more entries being received than can be accommodated, ewe entries will be reduced to one in each class from any one Exhibitor. If necessary the number of sheep of each breed from any one Exhibitor may also be reduced to a figure determined by the Society. The Exhibitors will have the right to nominate the sheep to be withdrawn should this reduction be necessary.

OBJECTIVE MEASUREMENT CLASSES

135. All entries in the Objective Measurement classes must be drawn from the Ordinary classes. The winning exhibit in these classes is not eligible for Championships or Most Successful Exhibitor awards unless it has won its Ordinary class.

Exhibits will be measured by an approved operator.

LINCOLN BREEDERS' PLATE - A Special Card and Ribbon will be awarded to the Most Successful Exhibitor in this Section where the Exhibitor is also the breeder of the prize-winning sheep. Awards in Trophy classes will not be taken into consideration when deciding this award. The method of deciding this award will be found in regulation 133. (S010)

Section 84 - SCHOOLS COMPETITION

REGULATIONS

1. All Schools participating are required to have a Staff member, Parent or Guardian who is responsible for Students and Animals at all times.
2. Sheep entered must comply with all the Conditions of Entry as described in the Schedule and Entry Forms.
3. Detailed Judging Sheets will be distributed to all Schools upon entry.
4. Schools will be judged under four Sections.

"Characteristics of Wool Quality"

Students will learn about various wool characteristics and then will be assessed on their general wool characteristics knowledge and wool classing ability.

"Best Maintained Team"

- i.) Cleanliness of Pens
- ii.) Cleanliness of Area of Surrounding Sheep such as Laneways.
- iii.) Availability of Feed and Water.
- iv.) Presentation of Animals whilst penned.
- v.) Static displays of information regarding the Breed and Sheep exhibited, the Schools Agriculture Program and any other information deemed relevant.
- vi.) Participation and Presentation of Students.
- vii.) Student knowledge regarding the Stud, Sheep and general Industry issues.
- viii.) Handling of Sheep by Students whilst in Pens.

"Handling and Presentation Class"

"All breeds Class", for Students participating in the Schools Competition only. Students are judged on the presentation of the sheep, their handling ability and ring craft.

"Junior Judging"

Students will be judged on their ability to judge two different sheep breeds. There will be 2 student age group categories.

AGES 12 - 15

AGES 16 - 19

Scoring System

Points are awarded on a daily basis to Schools with regards to the sub sections for the "Best Maintained Team." These scores are totalled on the last day of competition to give an overall score to which additional points gained in the handling and Presentation Class are added. This total gives the overall winning School.
