RULES.

[As the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has resolved to hold their Shows under the rules of the English Kennel Club as adopted by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, and has recognised that Society as the local custodian of a stud register kept in accordance with the Kennel Club Rules, the following code is published for the guidance of the Society's Dog Shows.]

1. Every person who wishes to exhibit at any Show held under the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, must, at the time of entry, clearly identify, by name and age (if known), the dog he intends to exhibit, and the name and sire and dam (if known) must be given, unless the dog has been entered with his name and pedigree in the Stud Book kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, in which case it will be sufficient to mention him by his name and number only. If the dam was covered by more than one sire, the names of all of them must be mentioned; and in cases where the pedigree of a dog is not known, he shall be entered at each Show as "Pedigree unknown," unless his name has been duly registered in the Stud Book; and every dog exhibited must be *bona fide* property of the exhibitor in whose name he is entered, and must have been his or her *bona fide* property on the day of closing entries.

2. If the name of a dog which has won a prize has been changed, it is necessary on entering the said dog, to give his old as well as his new name every time he is exhibited, until the change has been duly registered in the Stud Book kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society; and if his name be changed again, all his names must be repeated for a like period.

3. Every dog exhibited at the Show held under the Rules must, previous to the time of entry for such Show, be entered in a registry of names kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, at their offices, one shilling each dog being the charge made for registration. A name that has been already assumed and duly registered in the Stud Book, kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or, in the Stud Book of the English Kennel Club, by the owner of a dog of the same breed, cannot be registered, unless by a distinguishing name or number. If the name of a dog is changed, the new name will require to be registered also.

4. Dogs that are already entered in the Stud Book of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or the Stud Book of the English Kennel Club, are exempt from the above rule, provided their name remain unchanged. Puppies exhibited in a class exclusively for litters of puppies are also exempt.

5. If a dog shall be entered without being clearly identified, as before directed by Rules 1, 2, 3, and 4, he shall forfeit any prize that may have been awarded to him; and if the omission be detected in time, he shall not be allowed to compete, and shall forfeit all entrance fees and subscriptions.

6. The Committee or authorities of any show may reserve to themselves the right of refusing any entries that they may think fit to exclude.

7. The breeder of a dog or bitch shall be considered to be the *bona fide* owner of the dam at the time she whelps. In cases, however, where a bitch is lent for breeding purposes, the person to whom the bitch is lent shall be considered the breeder of all puppies born during the period of such loan, provided he or she before the litter is born, send to the Secretary of this Society, or the Secretary of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, a statement of the facts, signed by himself or herself and the owner of the bitch.

8. A castrated dog or spayed bitch shall be disqualified from competing, or from receiving a prize if awarded.

9. Total blindness shall absolutely disqualify; partial blindness shall have great weight against a dog. Should a dog appear to be deaf or lame, it shall be disqualified, unless the owner can satisfy the judges that the defects are temporary.

10. Any person who is proved to the satisfaction of the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, to have been guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with dogs, dog shows, or field trials, may, in addition to any pecuniary penalty to which he may be liable, be declared incapable of competing for, or winning a prize at any show held under the Rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, for such period as the Council of the Society may decide upon.

11. No dog shall be qualified to compete, or entitled to receive a prize (if awarded), who is suffering from mange or any other form of contagious disease.

12. No person, except the duly qualified and appointed inspector, shall decide whether a dog is not suffering from mange. The Veterinary Inspector shall give his opinion to the Secretary or Council of the Show, in writing, and shall do so before the close of the Show.

13. A dog that has been exhibited, or has won a prize in a class exclusively for puppies under twelve months old, is not thereby excluded from being exhibited in a class where previous prize-winners are not allowed to compete.

14. In estimating the number of prizes a dog has won with reference to whether it should compete in a Champion Class or not, the number of prizes won shall be calculated up to 12 p.m. of the day previous to the day of closing entries for the Show.

15. No dog shall be qualified to compete in a Champion Class that has won less than three First Prizes at Shows held under these Rules, one of the wins being at this Society's Show, or at that of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or at one held under the Kenne Club Rules in England; and no dog shall be allowed to compete in an Open Class that is qualified to compete in a Champion Class at any Show where Champion Classes are provided for that breed.

16. No dog shall be allowed to compete in a Novice Class that has won a First Prize up to the time of judging such classes, but in the event of a winner being barred, his entry money shall be returned.

17. No dog or bitch shall be entitled to be called a Champion that has not won four First Prizes at Shows held in accordance with the conditions in Rule 15, one of the four First Prizes being in a Champion Class. An Extra Prize for the best of two or more classes, or a prize in a class exclusively for Puppies under twelve months old, shall not count as a win. If a First Prize winner is disqualified, the next dog in order of merit as placed by the Judge shall be considered first, and the win shall count in every respect the same as if it had been the original award. An equal Champion, or First Prize, shall be counted as a win to both dogs.

18. An objection to a dog may be made by any person; it must be made to the Council or Secretary of the Show at any time within seven days from the last day of the Show. The objection must be in writing and the objector must (unless in cases where the objection is laid by the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, or by the regularly constituted Council of a Show, in which cases a deposit shall not be necessary) at the same time lodge a sum of £1 in the hands of the Committee or Secretary, which deposit shall, if the objection be proved frivolous, be forfeited.

19. In the above Rules the word, "Dog" shall be interpreted to include both sexes.

NOTE—Any dog not previously registered in accordance with Rule 3, may be registered at this Society's office at the time of entry for Show, on payment of the registration fee of one shilling.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. All dogs must have chains and collars, without names, attached to enable them to be taken out if required.

2. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

3. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards be permitted to loose their dogs for exercise for a short time each day in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove the same from the Yards without a written order from the Secretary, and a deposit of £2. (See General Regulations, Clause 2.)

4. Dogs considered by the Stewards and hon. Veterinary Surgeon unfit for Exhibition, either from disease, vice, or other causes will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

5. Dogs to be in their places in the Yards on Wednesday by 10 o'clock.

NOTE.—The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to take charge of the dogs.

MR. BIGG, of Thalgara, writes that if properly used it is an unqualified success. He finds the best time to apply it to saplings is when the bark strips freely, either by ringing at ground level, or cutting the saplings off close to the ground, and then applying the mixture well to the stumps.

The Patentees have every reason to believe that when water is scarce it will be equally effective if applied in the form of a thick paste. There can be no question about its being the CHEAPEST—in fact the only way in which to kill stringy-bark and other saplings.

MR. INGRAM, of Book Book, Wagga Wagga, N.S.W., has found it a complete success in killing all kinds of eucalyptus scrub.

We do not claim for the "SCRUB EXTERMINATOR" that it will kill trees by boring and inserting it into the trunk—nothing will do this. If applied in this way it will kill a strip the width of the white wood with which it comes in contact, from the top of the tree to the lowest end of one of the roots, proving that it would have destroyed the whole tree had it been brought into contact with the white wood all round. One great mistake many people make is in not applying it in sufficient quantities, forgetting that if once thoroughly done, the work is done for ever, and no aftergrowth to be again cut.

What we principally claim for the "SCRUB EXTERMINATOR," made under the new patent, is, that by a special process, known only to ourselves, we have discovered the means of rendering it dissolvable in cold water whilst still retaining its portable form.

It should be applied to garden paths when the ground is moist, and not in very hot sunny weather. If thoroughly applied it will effectually destroy the weeds—even couch and sorrel—for years.

Saplings should be treated only when the sap is up and the bark strips freely.

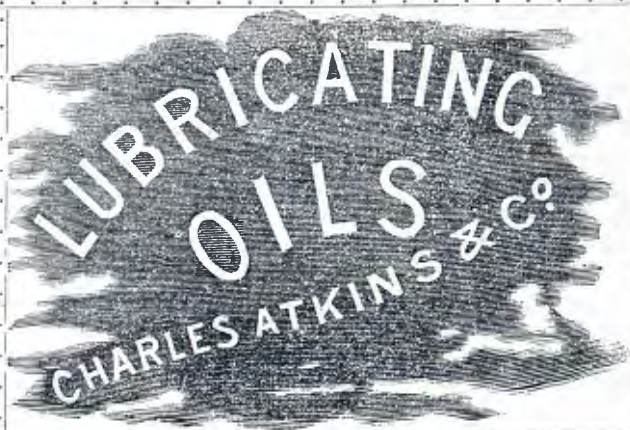
