TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

Ladies and Gentlemen—

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1902:—

Purchase of Land.

In April your Council purchased a block of land adjoining the Show Grounds, on the east side, one and a half acres in extent, for £1,400; terms one-third cash, the balance in two years at 4 per cent. They also secured permissive occupancy of a small triangular piece of ground between this purchased property and the railway.

Permanent Buildings and Works.

In the last report it was stated that the Works Committee had been authorised to have specifications prepared and tenders called for providing viewing accommodation for the public in the arena at the Show Grounds. This was done, and the tender of Messrs. Wilson and Heath, of £2,961 19s. 4d. was accepted, it being arranged that

the work should begin immediately after the show. The contractors, who commenced promptly at the close of the exhibition, have already made such progress that the work is well on towards completion. All the buildings on the grounds requiring attention were painted during the year by day labour, the Society supplying the materials. The land recently purchased and the small triangular block adjoining it were fenced in, and added to the Show Grounds. The amount of outlay for improvements, etc., including £914 16s. 3d. progress payments for cutting down the hill, was £1,915 7s. 6d., bringing the total expenditure on permanent buildings, works, and maintenance at the grounds up to £40,603 5s. 2d.

The Exhibition.

The annual exhibition was held on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th of September. The prize schedule was thoroughly revised, but not much alteration was made in the classes, except that those in the dog section were reduced in number, while those in the poultry were increased. The prize money was much as before, excepting that a large number of silver medals were substituted for certificates of merit as third prizes. The record number of 5,293 entries was received. The gate money, including £450 at the grand stand, amounted to £3,525 8s., being £46 4s. 9d. behind the previous year.

Reviewing the exhibits in the order of the schedule, the draught horses, as well as showing a considerable increase in numbers, also reached a high standard of excellence, the competition throughout being very keen. There was a fairly good entry in the thoroughbred stallion class, but otherwise the section was a blank. The trotting section was well filled, a number of recent importations attracting much attention. Roadsters, hackney stallions, and Clevelands do not appear to find favor with breeders, as very few were shown. The hunting and high-jumping classes were short in entries from the year before, but filled sufficiently to maintain the interest of the public in the events. Light harness horses were an improvement on last year, as also were the saddle and harness ponies. Shorthorn cattle again showed a large increase in numbers, and comprised animals of very high merit, but the entries were unduly swelled with a number of young sale stock in poor condition. Milking shorthorns, classes for which were first introduced last year, have already

become an important section, attracting much attention. Herefords and polled Angus, while confined to few owners, contained animals of exceptional quality. Ayrshires and Jerseys, although somewhat short of last year's excessive entry, were important and attractive sections, and Holsteins, Kerries, and Dexter-Kerries were again in evidence after the previous year's break. Dairy cattle were numerous, the milch cow test prize again being the subject of keen interest. Merino sheep were better represented than has been the case for some years, while longwools generally held their own, and the Shropshires were one of the strongest sections in the whole show, having made very rapid strides in public estimation. The swine classes were well filled with good stock, as shown by the high prices realised by exhibits at the sales on the grounds. The new classification of poultry resulted in an increased entry, while dogs were short in numbers, as was to be expected from the classes having been reduced. An increased entry in carriages, buggies, etc., resulted in very keen competition in that section. There was a shrinkage in the farm produce section, while dairy produce was rather better filled than usual with exhibits of excellent quality. Wines, etc., were better represented than before, but the number of exhibits has not increased in late years to any great extent. In addition to the tabulated exhibits there were 184 stands, against 178 last year, of machinery in motion, implements, and miscellaneous exhibits, which required so much space that a considerable portion of the new ground was occupied, the section being better filled than ever before. The weather, which had been fine for some time, broke on the opening day of the show with a terrific duststorm, and was afterwards gusty, showery, and unpropitious, except on the closing day, thus marring the success of the exhibition in point of attendance, which was rather behind that of last year. These adverse weather conditions were much to be regretted, as the exhibition generally was the most extensive and representative ever organized and carried out by the society.

Flock Book.

In the last report it was stated that the second volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Victoria was well in hand, and would shortly be available. The work was duly published in February, and was most favorably noticed in the press. The book may be purchased at the office at 5s., and copies of the first volume are also obtainable at the same price. Breeders have been somewhat remiss in sending in their annual returns this year, and they are reminded that these returns should be attended to, in order to make the Flock Book continuously successful.

Chamber of Agriculture.

This Chamber has continued to make good progress. During the year a movement was set on foot in the Goulburn Valley to establish a Rural Producers' Association. A proposition was carried at a conference at Shepparton in July to form such an association, and it was immediately resolved that it should be joined with the Chamber. The union was ratified at a conference in Melbourne on the night following the third annual meeting of the Chamber in September, the institution being designated the Victorian Chamber of Agriculture and Rural Producers' Association. Mr. F. Peppin has been nominated as the society's representative for election to the Council.

The Council.

At their first meeting in February the Council elected Mr. Job Smith president, and Messrs. J. H. Finlay, G. T. Chirnside, and T. F. Cumming vice-presidents. In January Mr. George Fairbairn was elected to fill the vacancy mentioned in the last report. In September Mr. William Glover resigned his seat on the Council through continued ill-health. Mr. Glover was elected to the Council at the annual meeting in 1887. He was highly esteemed by his fellow members, who ordered that a letter of sympathy be forwarded to him. In December Mr. J. I. Fisker and the Hon. E. H. Cameron, M.L.A., resigned their seats through being unable to give the necessary time to the business of the Society, and their resignations were accepted with regret. Mr. Fisker was elected to the Council at the annual meeting in 1894, and Mr. Cameron at the corresponding meeting in 1897. In December, also, the death of Mr. John Bond, which was caused by an accident was reported, and the Council, after expressing their great regret at the unfortunate occurrence, ordered that a letter of condolence be forwarded to his widow and family. Mr. Bond was elected to the Council in August, 1890, in the room of Mr. John Jones, who had lost his seat through non-attendance.

Acknowledgments.

The Council wish to express their cordial thanks to His Excellency the Acting Governor-General and Lady Tennyson for visiting the Show. They also desire to thank His Excellency the State Governor and Lady Clarke for their patronage and presence. They thank the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture for granting champion prizes, with champion gold and silver medals, for competition at the Show. They wish to acknowledge the continued liberality of donors to the prize fund. They thank the judges at the Show for

their valuable services, gratuitously rendered, and the stewards for their active assistance. They are much indebted to the press for valuable co-operation and assistance, which they heartily acknowledge; and they desire to thank all who have aided them during the year.

General.

(MEMBERSHIP.)

In addition to the work of the collector, special action was taken during the year to increase the number of subscribers by the issue of 9,000 circulars. As it is found that a good many members drop out every year from one cause and another, continuous effort is necessary to keep up and increase the numbers. It is gratifying to report that there are now 1296 subscribers on the roll, an increase of over 90 from last year, when 1200 was reached for the first time.

(PHOTOGRAPH OF COUNCIL.)

In March it was resolved to have a picture of the office-bearers of the Society in 1901, commemorative of the Commonwealth year. Mr. Staughton was good enough to donate £10 to the object, and this amount covered the whole cost of a framed group of photographs, which was executed by Messrs. Johnstone, O'Shannessy and Co., and is now an interesting ornament to the Society's offices.

(DEATH OF AUDITOR.)

In August, the death of Mr. B. D. Smith, the Society's auditor, was reported. Mr. Smith, who for seven years previously had acted as honorary auditor to the Society, was appointed paid auditor in 1898, in the room of Mr. John McDonald, deceased.

(THE JOURNAL.)

The agreement with Messrs. J. Twomey and Co., the publishers of the journal, has been renewed, for twelve months, on the same terms as before. The journal is issued free to subscribers for 12 months, beginning in November of each year.

(DROUGHT RELIEF FUND.)

In November the Council resolved to donate £50 towards the Drought Relief Fund, inaugurated by the Mayor of Melbourne. It is gratifying that the drought has since practically broken up.

(FINANCE.)

In the financial statement published herewith it is shown that the revenue for the year amounts to £8,135 15s. 8d., against £7,309 15s. 5d. last year—an increase of £826 0s. 3d., which is very satisfactory, in view of the adverse season throughout Australia and the bad weather encountered at the Show. The expenditure (including £2,156 16s. in cash prizes and medals), amounted to £7,715 18s. 3d. The overdraft has been reduced by £419 7s. 6d., while during the year £1,915 7s. 6d. has been spent in buildings and permanent improvements, and £466 13s. as part purchase of land, which items are assets, so that practically the working expenses show a profit of £2801 18s. 4d. for the year. The overdraft stands at £1,836 19s. 3d., against £2,256 16s. 9d. last year.

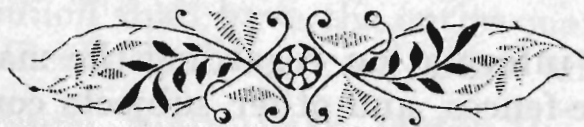

RULES.



1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial Resources of the State.

- (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications, scientific and other works, as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.
- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and

periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9.) By remunerating any person, if thought fit—who shall ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice—for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the annual meeting next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, they shall at time of paying such subscription nominate one of the members of the Firm or Company who shall be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges attached to such membership, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-two members, elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society, as hereinafter provided, and also the Trustees, who shall be ex officio members of the Council.

7. One-half of the Council, except the Trustees, shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified or until they are removed in due form at the annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations having been

submitted at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the second Tuesday in January following, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid and an Honorary Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies, to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

18. The annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send to all subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper, numbered and initialled by the President or his deputy, with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy at the election. Every such ballot paper shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance-Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten members of the Society, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A special meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-Room, and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand-stands at all times. And while the Society publishes a monthly journal, a copy shall be posted free to each Member.

25. Any member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

26. Any person being disqualified by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a member or to exhibit at this Society's Exhibitions until such disqualification be removed, provided such disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

27. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules, by-laws, regulations, or provisions shall be determined by the Council, whose decision shall be final.

28. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.

General Meetings.

1. Notice of the Preliminary, Annual, and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and the minutes of the preceding Preliminary General Meeting, shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

3. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting, nominations to be made at the former meeting and elections to take place at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

The President

4. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name or on behalf of the Council.

The Council.

5. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

6. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

7. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

8. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

9. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting, and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

10. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

11. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibition.

12. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

13. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

14. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

15. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

16. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or other Members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

17. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

18. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

19. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies.
- (4.) Finance Committee's Report.
- (5.) Correspondence.
- (6.) Postponed business.
- (7.) Motions.
- (8.) Notices of motions.

20. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

21. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

Committees.

22. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

23. The President shall be ex-officio a Member of all Committees.

24. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

25. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that Standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

The Secretary.

26. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bankers. He shall have the charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

28. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, etc., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

Finance.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary

Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting in the following form :—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the Meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, assisted by an honorary auditor, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
